Agenda Item 1:

President Kahla called the Meeting to order at 6:00 P.M.

Agenda Item 2:

The meeting was opened with a prayer by Jerry Shadden.

Agenda Item 3:

There was no Public Comment.

Agenda Item 4:

President Kahla stated that only Richard "Rick" Nicely would be sworn in today as Victor Caraway was ineligible to serve on the Board as he was in the same Precinct as Mr. Nicely.

Kate Leverett, District Counsel, swore in Richard "Rick" Nicely as Director for Precinct 2.

Agenda Item 5:

Director Hankamer made a motion to adopt Resolution 22-04 TBCD Bank Account Signatory Resolution per Section 49.151 of the Texas Water Code. Director Turner seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 6:

After a discussion, Director Hankamer made a motion to solicit Request for Proposals for Application Development and Grant Administrative Service for the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TEDM), Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)- DR-4485 COVID-19 Pandemic. Director Turner seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 7:

A motion was made by Director Hankamer to solicit Request for Proposals for Application Development and Engineering Service for the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TEDM), Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)- DR-4485 COVID-19 Pandemic. Director Turner seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Director Hankamer to adopt Order 22-01, Criteria for Purposes of Redistricting of the Trinity Bay Conservation District political boundaries. The motion was seconded by Director Turner, and it passed by a unanimous vote.

After a discussion, Director Hankamer made a motion to set the Public Hearing regarding adoption of revised political boundaries of the Trinity Bay Conservation District following the 2020 Census, inconformity with application state and federal law for May 11, 2022, at 8:30 A.M. The motion was seconded by Director Turner, and it passed unanimously.

Discussion for possible consideration providing outside counsel, if needed, authorization to proceed with audit and investigation of personnel affairs, was moved to Executive Session.

The Board adjourned to Executive Session at 6:26 P.M. to discuss Agenda Item #12.
